

**Moreno Valley Animal Services

A. Shelter Services:

The following illustrates the number of positive outcomes of shelter pets during the month of April 2018 (family adoptions, pets rescued, reclaimed by their owners, TNR program, and pets transferred to pet adoption centers).

Animal Rescue Coordinator Update

The Animal Rescue Coordinator reported the following results during this month:

During this month, the Animal Rescue Coordinator helped perform temperament testing on 151 dogs along with facilitating the transfer to our rescue partners the following 75 pets (dogs & cats) with a variety of medical conditions or special needs:

Animal Type – Breed	Medical Condition
67 Cats	6 females w/25 newborns; 2 pregnant; 29 under-aged kittens w/o maternal care (newborns to one month); 2 cats w/ ringworm; 1 cat w/ leg paralysis; 1 cat w/ internal injuries; and 1 senior cat (15 yrs. old)
3 Chihuahuas	1 attacked by two pitbulls; 1 w/ mammary tumors & 1 senior w/diabetes, tumors & heart murmur

1 German Shepherd	Pup w/ parvovirus
2 Labrador Retrievers	1 aggressive w/ small dogs & 1 dehydrated
2 Pit-bulls	1 w/ deformity & behavior issues & 1 w/ skin condition

In addition, the Animal Rescue Coordinator facilitated the transfer of 21 dogs (9 to Oregon Humane & 12 to Pasadena Humane) via the ASPCA ground transport program. Five wild birds (4 newly hatched ravens & 1 owl) were transferred to Project Wildlife for rehabilitation.

B. Field Services:

Field Services operates on a 7 day, 24 hour response based on level of priority. There are 6 Animal Control Officers along with 1 Animal License Inspector and 1 Field Services Supervisor currently serving the City.

Animal Control Officers rotate daily for Night Truck duty and remain available to respond to high priority calls after hours. During normal business hours, Animal Control Officers are available daily to respond to routine and high priority service requests. The Animal License Inspector conducts canvassing efforts throughout the City's many neighborhoods to inform residents of the legal requirement to have all dogs currently vaccinated against rabies and maintain current dog licenses.

C. Other Activities:

Low-Cost Rabies Vaccination & Dog Licensing Clinic Results

On Saturday, April 14, 2018 the Animal Shelter held a low cost rabies vaccination and dog licensing clinic at the Animal Shelter. Dog and cat owners took advantage of the reduced pet vaccination fees along with being able to renew or purchase their dog's license as well as purchase a HomeAgain microchip for only \$10. Potential adopters took advantage of the reduced pet adoption fees for dogs at only \$30 and cats at \$15 while Challenge participants along with their pooches walked their dogs to raise donations in an effort to help support lifesaving programs at the shelter.

Save A Life Earth Day Pet Adoption Event Results

This annual pet adoption promotion held at the Animal Shelter was held for 5 days this year and the results reflect more positive outcomes for our shelter pets. From Tuesday, April 17th to Thursday, April 19th, & Tuesday, April 24th to Wednesday, April 25th, a total of **98 pets were adopted** (33 family adoptions and 65 rescues).
