## MOVAL ALERT

The City of Moreno Valley's Emergency Alert and Warning Notification System, known as MoVal Alert, sends rapid notifications to all residents and businesses in the event of an emergency or disaster, including coronavirus.

Residents may receive notifications via landline, cell phone, text message and/or email.

For phones, the system will automatically call listed and unlisted telephone numbers and deliver a recorded message. If phone lines are busy, the system will redial those numbers. If the call goes to voicemail, the emergency message will be left there.
