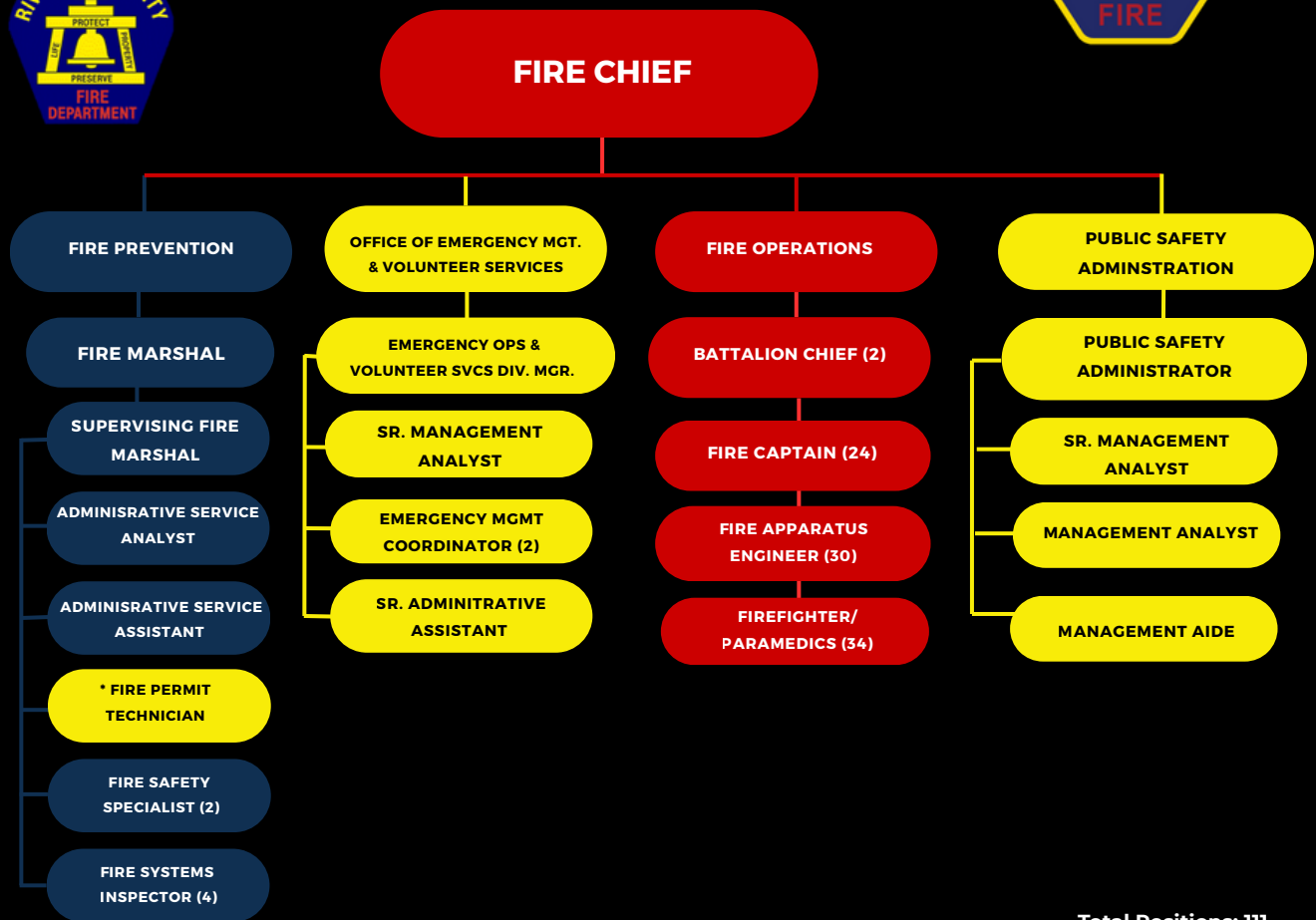

SIGNIFICANT INCIDENT

On Thursday, January 22, CAL FIRE/Riverside County firefighters responded to a two-vehicle collision involving a fully involved fire in District 4 at Zaharias Street and Dunes Way. Both vehicles were engulfed in flames, which extended into the garage of a two-story residence. Due to the rapid and effective response by firefighters, the fire was quickly contained, resulting in limited damage to one vehicle and the garage door. The prompt suppression efforts prevented further extension of the fire, and the residents were not displaced. No injuries were reported to firefighters or civilians. The City's Building and Safety Division was notified and assigned to conduct a follow-up inspection to assess the structure for safety.

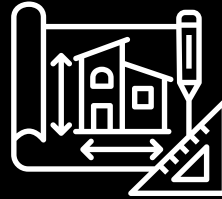

HIGHLIGHT OF THE MONTH

January 23-25, the Office of Emergency Management hosted Teen CERT for a three-day training offered to high schools in Moreno Valley. Participants included students from Valley View High School, Vista del Lago High School, and Canyon Springs High School. The Teen CERT class teaches teens basic emergency preparedness and disaster response skills, including fire safety, first aid, light search and rescue, and teamwork. The program builds confidence, leadership, and the ability to safely help others during emergencies until professional responders arrive.
